THE INDIAN DATURA SEED. A Poison That is Often Used by Robbers to Overcome Their Victims. It has been remarked that one of the greatest objections to the suppression of hemp cultivation for smoking purposes in India is that it would drive the natives to the use of more dangerous sedatives.
