However, I hear here and there complaints of the asparagus being too tough, the old green shoots, grown overground, being preferred by many and sold to many on account of their being more tender. With due respect to the calinary art of the white and black presiding ladies at the Asheville kitchens I cannot but say that the toughness of the asparagus is entirely the result of wrongly handling this vegetable after it has left the garden and that the grower guarantees it to be tender down to the root end when handled and cooked properly. The following remarks will help to do so: "1. Never buy more asparagus at a

time than you will use the day of buying. It is the advantage of the home market that it offers fresh vegetables.

2. If for some reason you should be obliged to buy a larger supply, keep it in wet sand. It becomes dry and tough when kept in the open air of pantry or cellar, and tasteless and flabby if kept in

"3. Scrape the asparagus before cook-ing. Take the shoot in your left hand, holding the bud end gently between the thumb and two first fingers, the root end resting on the lower part of the palm: then with a sharp knie beginning 11-inches from the bud, scrape slightly down and remove the outer tough skin. turning the asparagus with thumb and second finger as you proceed. 




