NORTH CAROLINA NEWS

CHANGE OF MINISTERS

Japan Shuffles Its Diplomats from Pillar to Post. WASHINGTON, July 26.—Mr. Gazo Tanno, Japanese Minister, has been recalled and will present his letters of recall to the President this week, so as to start for Japan Monday. The term of service in the Japanese diplomatic corps at one post is three years and Tanno has been in the United States nearly four years. He will probably be transferred to some European legation. He will be succeeded as minister to the United States by Mr. Kato, who was graduated at Yale and was a student of the Cambridge, Mass., Law School. He is now vice-minister of agriculture and commerce.

PHOENIX STRIKER

A Rioter Arrested and a Policeman Beaten. CHICAGO, July 26.—Policeman Lindgren was seriously wounded and two rioters were badly hurt in a fight which occurred in the Grand Trunk yards at 30th street yesterday. A small crowd of strikers attempted to stop a freight train, and when the officer went to the rescue he was met with a volley of stones and coupling pins. He fell, bruised in a dozen places. Regarding his feet Lindgren fled, probably fatally injuring Alexander Hurt and slightly wounding a striker named Donnigan. But one of the rioters was arrested.
