TAKE NOTE. A General Assembly is to be chosen at this election, and that Legislature, under the Constitution of this State, is vested with powers to reverse the political condition of every County in North Carolina.

First. In order to bring the question of good roads before the people in the most practical way, and as an introduction to those who may have doubt as to the great importance of MacAdams roads in our county, we recommend that you select a committee consisting of five or more prominent citizens which hereby it may charge to go to the county seat and purchase an automobile.

After the roads were put to the established grade, they will be fitted on each side to a depth of twelve inches with gravel, and on the bottom of MacAdams (leaving it well crowned), placing in terra cotta drain pipes as frequently as necessary to carry the water from the roadway in large quantities.

TAKE NOTE. We recommend that for the first four miles of road from Asheville, the road be MacAdams, to a depth of twelve inches, and from that point to be built to a depth of twelve inches.
