PORTO RICO'S FIRST

ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF THE NAVY ALLEN CONSENTS TO TAKE THE PLACE.

Washington, April 12.-Charles H. Al en, at present assistant secretary of the navy, will be the first civil governor of Porto Rico under the provision of the bill passed yesterday by the house of representatives.

While formal tender and aceptance of the position cannot be made until the president has signed the bill, it is known that McKinley has been bringing pressure to induce Allen to relin-quish care of his private interests for a sufficient time at least to instal! a new civil government in the island, and the latter has consented to assume the new responsibilities.

lnasmuch as the act takes effect on the first of next month, but little time is left in which to outline a skeleton of government, including the formation of a cabinet. It is understood the new governor will be taken to Porto Rico in one of the finest vessels of the navy.
