BITTER CAUCUS FIGHT ENDS AND CUBA WILL GET RELIEF

(Special to The Citizen.) Washington, D. C., March 19.-The ways and means committee, representing the administration, met the beet sugar enemy at the fifth party conference last night and they are theirs. After the test vote on ordering the previous question had been put, revealing a majority of the leaders of 22, most of the sugar beets threw up their hands, the beet sugar amendments were voted down and the ways and means committee's plan providing for a 20 per cent outright reciprocal tariff reduction on Cuban exports amended by the Sibley proposition to last only until December, 1903, was ratified by the caucus by a

No pledge was made that the Senate would not amend it further, and the latter body expects to increase the reduction substantially and probably also the time during which it shall run. The next step of the leaders will be to bring in a bill to this effect in the


