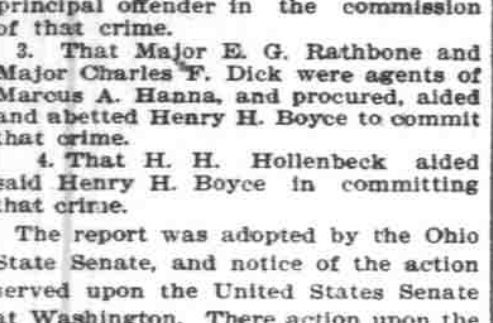
The Tax on Brokers
