WASHINGTON, June 18:- Just be fore adjournment tonight the senate adopted by a vote of 44 to 32 the amendment of the senate committee on finance fixing a duty of \$4 a ton on print paper, in place of the house rate of \$2 a ton, but the other mendments to the wood pulp and print paper achedules had not been was renerally considered a prelim acted upon when the senate adjourned at 7 o'clock.

After this vote had been taken there was an effort to reach an agreement upon a time for voling upon the various income and corporation tax propositions.
