The address was notable chiefly for the recommendation that congress should enact a law providing for nationally created corporations to carry un its terstate commerce. Mr. Wickersham sketched the ways by which states may regulate business of foreign cur porations within our boundaries.

Many will object to the centralizing tendency of a national law author izing the formation of corporation to carry on interstate business," said Mr. Wickersham, "but such a law seems to me to be the inevitable result of economic conditions."
