## **MOBAVENGES** FOUL MURDEROFMOTHER AND LITTLE BABE

Negro to Hide More Horrible Crime Kills Both And Throws Bodles in Lake

LYNCHERS GIVE HIM SHORT SHRIFT AT ROPE

Sheriff's Efforts to Save Flend's Life Circumvented by Neighbors

(By Associated Press.) FITZGERALD, Ga., August 20 .-Henry Taylor, a negro exconent. charried with assaulting Mrs. Josh Vickers. Tuesday and then murdering her and her infant, was this afternoon taken from the sheriff of Witcox county, between Lumpkins Ferry reports reaching here tonight.

The crime for which the negro paid the penalty at the hands of indignant ever recorded in the criminal annals citizens was one of the most brutal of Georgia

Mrs. Vickers and her eight months old baby were left at their home at Lampkins Ferry Tuesday afternoon and that night when the husband and father returned from his work both his wife and buby were missing. search revealed the fact that they were not at the home of any neighbor. Soon their disappearance, with suspleion of foul play, was known throughout the neighborhood and search for them was immediately commenced. Thursday afternoon the bodies were found in a pond not a great ways from the Vickers home The woman had been assaulted and then choked to death, while the baby's skull had been crushed.

Negro Disappeared. Henry Taylor had told of seeing Mrs. Vickers, with her baby, go in the direction of the pond in which their bodies were found. Suspicion was immediately directed toward him apon the finding of the bodies, but he had disappeared. Early today Taylor was arrested in Ben Hill County, near Lumpkins Ferry. He was taken in charge by the sheriff of Wilcox county, who immediately started for Fitzgerald. Finding that his way was blocked by the presence of large numbers of aroused people, a circuitous route was taken. The citizens, how-
