The finding, late today, of three more bodies of terribly heaten strike sympathizers was also herrifying in its ghastliness, for troopers who were dead and wounded, made little effort to spare the feelings of the men who gathered about them when the bodies. two under a pile of rathrood ties, and one under a culvert on the tracks of the Pittsburg and Lake Eric ratifood were pulled into signt. The corpses. hardly recognizable as those of human beings, were hastily paid into a morgue wagon and turned over to the county officials.

With the burial of the dead strikers and the finding of the additional bodles, came a truce to hostilities. From dawn to nightfall not a pistol shot was heard; neither was an arrest

HUNDREDS DROWN AS TWO STEAMERS CRASH TOGETHER

Passengers Were Asleep In Their Cabins When One Boat Went Down

WOMEN AND CHILDREN PRINCIPAL VICTIMS

Many Men And Almost All of Steamer's Crew Made Good Their Escape

(By Associated Press.)

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, August 24 - In a driving rainsform about six o'clock this morning the Argentine excuration steamer Colombia, and the North German Lloyd steamer Schlesian, collided at the entrance of Montevideo harbor. The Colombia was entering port and the Schlesien was outward bound for Bremen, The bolombia's bow was crushed in and the sank almost immediately. tween 150 and 200 persons were killed or drowned.

The Colombia carried about two numbered passengers and a crew of crty-eight men. Most of the pastengers were asteep and panie foiowed the crash. Almost immediatesmall bonts put out to the sinkng steam, but the work of rescue was rendered very difficult by the high sen. About seventy persons were brought achore. Most of the dead are women and children. Going to Fete.

The Colombia was earrying excurions from Buenos Ayres to a festical at Montevideo, and the disaster has caused the keenest emotion. The Uruguayan government in consequence has postponed the fetes arranged for the celebration of the inauguration of the port. The Schlesien which was only
