NEW TELEPHONE LINE WILL BE CONSTRUCTED

A stock company for the building of a telephone line from Candler to Asheville has been organized and the stockholders given permission by the county commissioners to erect poles. Work will begin on the construction of the line within a short while. W. H. Pearson was awarded the contract for getting out the poles. About 400 poles will be required to build the line, which will accommodate the residents of the north and south Hominy valley, Beaverdam and Pole creek valley, where several telephones are now in operation. It is thought that a switchboard will be installed either at Candler or Hominy.

Mrs. Whitted's cooking demonstrations and use of the gas range, at the Y. M. C. A. auditorium have been of unusual interest to women and each afternoon there are few vacant seats in the auditorium. Lessons are free and any one may go each afternoon of the week from three thirty until five thirty, and pleasantly hear just how to cook a meal and be instructed in the usage of the gas range, its oven, broilers, etc. Electric fans cool the auditorium each afternoon.
