FINE POULTRY SHOW NOW SEEMS ASSURED

FAIR ASSOCIATION ENGAGES EXPERT FOR DEPARTMENT.

Even Dozen Infants Have Been Entered Already for Better Babies' Contest.

With the intention of making the poultry display at the coming Western North Carolina fair one of the biggest ever held in the south, the officers of the association will engage the services of J. C. H. Wilson, a poultry expert and fancier of Balsam, to take charge of the department, devoting his entire time later on to this feature of the third annual fair, which will be held at Riverdale park, Asheville, October 7, 8, 9 and 10. Mr. Wilson was recommended to the fair association by H. E. Cain, of Troutman, Iredell county, who is to be the director of the poultry exhibits, designated as Department "E" again this year. Mr. Cain, in a letter received at fair headquarters yesterday, said that everything is exceedingly bright for a splendid show of birds. James F. Kerr will act as judge, and the premiums will be open to North Carolina exhibitors, the right being reserved, through the directors of the department, to accept or reject any exhibits. The entry books will close Saturday, October 4. The following will be the premiums:

Rule 1. Judging will be by comparison.

Rule 2. Unless there are four entries in each class of cocks, cockerels, hens, pullets and pens, first honor will be awarded and second money paid.

Rule 3. No money will be paid unless there are two or more specimens in each class.

Rule 4. Birds not arriving by 10 a. m., Tuesday, October 7, will be debarred from competing for premiums.

Notes—The terms "cock," "hen," etc., are thus defined: Cock, a male specimen hatched prior to 1913; cockerel, a male specimen hatched during 1913; hen, a female specimen hatched prior to 1913; pullet, a female specimen hatched during 1913.

Each pen to consist of one male and four females, when entered as a pen, specimen cannot compete in open classes.

Mr. and Mrs. Taylor are the first to enter two babies from the same family. Special cards of instructions, to the parents of the infants who are to be entered in the better babies' contest, are now being prepared by the officers of the fair association and will be ready for distribution in about a week or ten days.

CIRCUS WILL MAKE VISIT TO ASHEVILLE

Barnum & Bailey's Show Will Pitch Tent Here Next Month—Advance Man Here.

The reign of the red lemonade, to say nothing of the toy balloons, is approaching, the advance agent for Barnum & Bailey's circus having spent yesterday in this city making arrangements for the appearance of the big shows here September 21. The "show man" paid a visit to the city and county tax collectors and emerged from both offices wearing a smile but minus a voucher. Within the next few days Asheville billboards, sides of buildings and show windows of vacant store rooms will put on their gaudy attire, heralding the coming of the clowns, the elephants and the water animals. The big street parade is going to be discussed by the young fellows during the next few weeks and boys and girls will begin today to save their pennies in order that they may take a look-in upon the rings.

The appearance of Barnum & Bailey's circus here next month will give Asheville fun-seekers an opportunity to see a big show for the first time in four years. Four years ago they had an opportunity to invest in peanuts and look at the menagerie, but since that time the circus men have forgotten that this city is seeking amusement. However, they are beginning to realize that they have been overlooking a mighty good thing, and Barnum & Bailey's man was the first to put up the cash necessary to allow his people to pitch their tents here.
