MAN NOMINATIONS OF GENERAL OFFICERS ARE MADE BY THE PRESIDENT

New Major Generals, Brigadier Generals and Others are Named.

SENT TO SENATE.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14.—Nomination of nearly 500 general officers in the national army, including officers of the regular army and the national guard, were sent to the senate today by President Wilson.

Coincident with this announcement of high command came the statement from the war department that a composite national guard division, composed of troops from twenty-six states and the District of Columbia, was in process of organization.

The list of major-generals takes in virtually all of the army brigadiers and includes the only two national guard officers of that rank, General O'Ryan of New York and Clements of Pennsylvania.

POU PRESENTS THE WAR SITUATION TO MEETING

Points Out Necessity of Patriotic Service by Citizenship of State.

RALEIGH, Aug. 14.—Raleigh and surrounding country shared a great patriotic mass meeting tonight. The absorbing feature of the meeting was an address by James H. Pou, in which he presented the situation with the United States at war and the necessity of patriotic service by North Carolina citizenship.

Mr. Pou declared that "out of the horrors of this war will arise a greater and better, stronger and freer citizenship and higher ideals of government and of life. He pledged the vast audience to do and say nothing during the war that will in the least way tend to weaken the hand of the government, promptly and cheerfully do all the government asks, support no candidates for office who do not whole-heartedly support the country's cause of war, care for the families of the soldiers off at the front and give preference in all things possible to the soldiers who are off to do their duty as the war progresses. He assured the soldiers that they have his gratitude and love of a thousand million human beings in every quarter of the globe."

TRAVIS MAY GET JOB ON COMMERCE COMMISSION

Appointment Expected to Be Made by President Wilson This Week.

RALEIGH, N. C., Aug. 14.—The appointment of Chairman E. L. Travis, of the North Carolina corporation commission, to the federal commerce commission is expected to be made by President Wilson this week and it is understood that Governor Bickett will, as soon as he receives the resignation of Mr. Travis from the state commission, commission A. J. Maxwell, for present secretary of the commission, to a full fledged commissioner to succeed Mr. Travis. Thereafter the commission will proceed to re-organize and while nothing is being said as to the probable outcome, it is a fact that Commissioner W. T. Lee will be ranking commissioner through seniority and if he desires the post will doubtless be made chairman.
