### MORE SOLDIERS PASS THROUGH ASHVEILLE

FIVE TRAINLOADS SERVED WITH REFRESHMENTS YESTERDAY.

Five trainloads of South Dakota infantry 2,200 men in all, passed through Asheville yesterday, en route to "somewhere in America" and like all the soldiers passing through in the past few days, were served with coffee and refreshments by the canteen committee of which Mrs. Thomas S. "It is worth going to war to learn of the splendid hospitality of the people of Asheville and to be served with coffee and sandwiches by such charming girls and matrons," one young officer declared, just after an Asheville maiden had presented him with a smile, accompanied by a sandwich and a cup of coffee.

The committee was assisted in serving the refreshments by a number of the younger girls of the city, who worked enthusiastically in collecting funds for cigarettes, to be distributed in addition to the regular sandwich, chocolate and coffee menu.

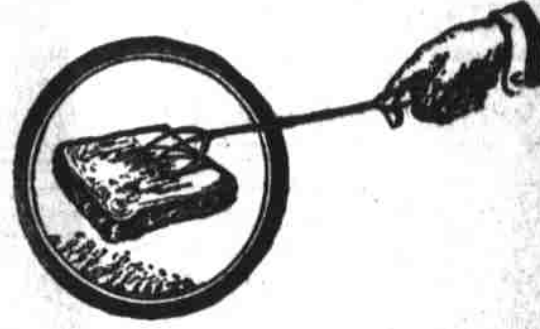

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### VISCOUNT ISHII AGAIN SAYS JAPAN WILL NOT IGNORE CHINESE RIGHTS

He Does Not, However, Imply Application of the "Monroe Doctrine." TALKS OF PLOT.

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—Japan's pledge to China that she will not violate her political independence or territorial integrity, was reiterated and given especial emphasis tonight by Viscount Ishii, head of the imperial Japanese mission at a dinner given by Oswald G. Villard.

"I want to make it very clear to you," said Viscount Ishii, "that the application of the term 'Monroe doctrine' to this policy and principle, voluntarily outlined and pledged by me is inaccurate.

### NORTH CAROLINIANS AT CAMP JACKSON REJECT

But State Makes Best Showing of Three Represented at the Camp.

COLUMBIA, S. C., Oct. 1.—North Carolinians sent home for physical disability in the second movement of the national army at Camp Jackson total 405 out of 4,681 men. Mustering officers are not pleased at this, claiming that it indicates lack of thoroughness on the part of the county boards.

A movement of national army troops will be made Wednesday, when men come from North Carolina, South Carolina and Florida. These men were not certified by district boards in time to move with the second increment. Two thousand South Carolina negroes will be mobilized between October 5 and October 7.
