HIGHWAY FORMALLY MAY ERECT COMMUNITY INFANTRY COMPANY OPENED YESTERDAY HOUSE IN ASHEVILLE TO CONTINUE SERVICE

Asheville-Hendersonville Road Ready for Travel—County and City Officials Present.

All obstructions to the Asheville-Hendersonville highway were removed Thursday morning in the presence of the city and county officials, representatives of the Board of Trade as well as other leading citizens. The highway is now open for general travel all the way through. At the present time Henderson county has a twelve-mile pavement from Pack square into the village of Arden, and one-half mile from the Henderson county line. The paving of which stretch is the most possible paving is planned for the Christmas season. A Patton of the county board.

Good road enthusiasts the freight of a dozen or more automobiles will be increased the highway opening and was passed by half a mile and nearly 1000 feet of which expressed pleasure at learning that all obstructions on the road had been removed. The small unpaved portion of the road is said to be in fair condition, being of sand macadam in Buncosville county and of sand clay in Henderson county. Chairman Patton expects the paving to be completed within thirty days after the work is started next spring. All the material will be placed on the ground and an effort will be made to establish a record in road building.

Since this road is a part of the famous Dixie highway, N. Rockner, secretary of the Board of Trade, has photographs of the road opening to be furnished to the Dixie Highway magazine.

WAR SERVICE SECRETARY ROBINSON EXPLAINS PLAN
Rotary Club Hears Proposition for House Established Jointly by Government and Asheville

Asheville's reserve infantry will maintain its organization for some months to come, according to instructions received last night from Adjutant General H. S. Robinson. In answer to an inquiry, secretary Robinson wired that John H. Gathie, not the commander of the company as follows: "Reserve infantry will continue to receive only regular action of the national guard. No reorganization of troops from this state now in federal service is planned."
As the national guard was scattered through many municipalities of the state and will probably not concentrate until late next year, the Asheville company is considered a necessary institution in any emergency that may arise. It is believed that a majority of the local infantrymen will welcome the opportunity to continue their drills and be ready to serve the community or the state should they be needed.
A successor to Captain Thomas J. Harkin has not yet been named, but it is expected that this matter will be settled in the near future.
There will be no drill next Thursday evening, the company being allowed that night off as part of its Christmas vacation from duty.
