THE MAJESTIC.

It is impossible to witness the film drama, "The Birth of a Nation," and not want to say something about it. Everyone who has seen it is saying something about it. When one has been crowded upon, pressed down and run over, it is against nature not to make some kind of an outcry.

That is the way one feels when coming out of the theatre. The thing is vast. It is overwhelming. Nothing like it has ever before been put upon the stage.

The tension of the performance is but a single feature of it—but it is that which one feels most poignantly after three straight hours. It begins in an easy way but commences soon to find its muscle and goes on to the end and a pounding upon one's senses with blows that come heavier and heavier, more and more rapid.

It is not apparent what are the grounds of the objections urged against it, nor what is the animus of those who are scheming to have the exhibition prohibited by court proceedings.
