The Stove league has been at work in many of the cities in this state during the past few weeks, and much hope of interesting nature has been turned out. This interest seems to center largely now on who is to manage the Sally league clubs. The dopsters are staying awake night trying to figure this out. One writer has lined up this way:
Ernie Burke will not return to Charlotte as manager and probably not as player.
Jimmy Manes is through at Charleston.
"Dolly" Stark has thrown up the sponge at Augusta.
Tom Clark may not return to the Columbia champs.
Billy Laval's standing in Greenville is unknown.
Only one club, the tall end Spartanburg aggregation, has signed its team leader for the coming season. He is Doug Harbison, who led the team in the final weeks of the 1919 campaign with or more or less success.
Tom Clark was reserved by Columbia for the coming season but it is known that he has ambitions to manage a higher class league.
Billy Laval hibernates at Greenville where he has many friends. However, there were many in the city who were not pleased with his work last season and there are rumors to the effect that he may be replaced. DON'T JAY-WALK THIS WEEK, POLICE WORN

Pedestrians Urged to Cross Crossings and Not in Middle of Streets—Big Crowds on Streets.

Don't jay-walk during the Christmas holidays, is the warning given by the department of public safety and to keep the people in the white traffic lines, they will be freshened up this week.
"Cross crossings at the corner; don't get in the middle of the street and try to break through the traffic, it is dangerous," the warning reads. Every effort will be put forth by the department to secure able first-class team leaders.

There were many who believed that the league moguls made a mistake in not adding Gastonia and Asheville to the circuit. Among these are president Felix Hayman of the Charlotte club. Both cities are geographically located so that they would be easily accessible to the other Sally cities and having backing to carry them through whether or not the club drew large crowds.
