Mrs. G. B. Mason, of Knoxville, Tenn., has returned to her home, after a brief visit with relative here.

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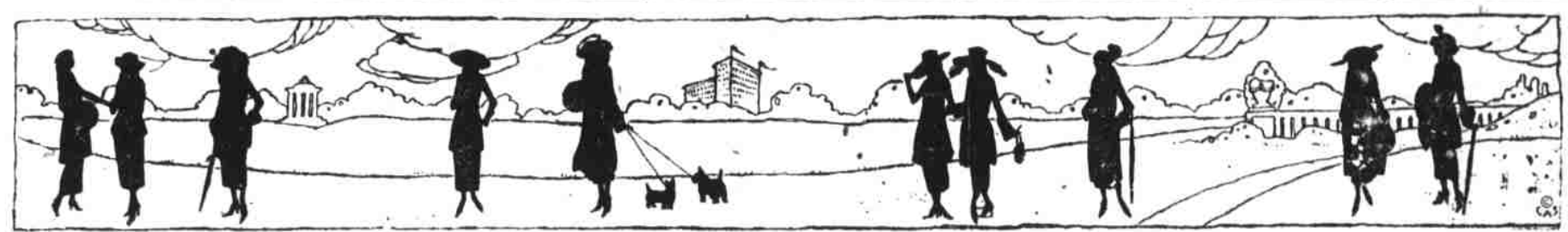
