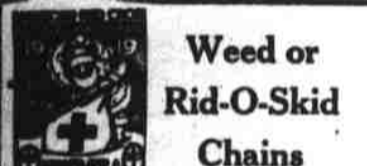

INHERITANCE TAX TOTALED \$29,882.51

SIXTY-SIX PERSONS TURN IN THAT AMOUNT DURING 1919.

Last Year Showed Slight Loss Over the Previous Year—Many Large Estates Represented in List.

Sixty-six persons paid inheritance taxes in this country last year, totaling \$29,882.51, which amount is considerably more than that paid in a great number of the counties of the state, according to information published during the year.

The largest amount paid in inheritance tax by an individual estate was that paid by the W. J. Slayden estate, totalling \$7,326.70. The second largest amount was paid by the Connally estate, \$6,008.53, and the third from the estate of the late Paul Roebeling, of \$4,030.00, while the fourth largest amount was paid from the estate of Helen Murphy, \$3,169.46.

There are a number of persons owing inheritance tax who have not paid into the clerk's office and those who have not settled according to law, are being asked to do so. The 1919 inheritance tax in Buncombe fell a little under that of 1918, and it is pointed out by John H. Cuthy, clerk of the court, that this is due to the fact that the inheritance tax on the Ernst estate, amounting to \$14,858.43, was paid in 1918. This is the largest amount of inheritance tax ever paid on an estate in this county, save that paid in 1916 on the George W. Vanderbilt estate, which amounted to the big sum of \$46,029.96. In 1918 another large estate was the subject for inheritance tax, that of Francis Pack, amounting to \$7,329.59. The total paid in 1918 was \$31,872.44, or \$1,989.93 more than was paid in inheritance tax during last year.

Under the inheritance tax law, persons over 21 years of age receiving in-

heritances from their parents, must pay the tax at the rate of one per cent on property in excess of \$2,000. Widows must pay one per cent on resources above \$10,000. The exemption for a minor child is \$5,000, and the rate one per cent. No exemption applies when a brother inherits from a brother and the rate is three per cent. If the inheritance is not from one's kinpeople no exemption is applicable and the rate is five per cent.

HEATING PLANT FOR ROSE HILL SCHOOL

Will Be Installed at the Close of the Present Session.

The school committee and a number of patrons met with Miss Terrell, superintendent, yesterday and decided to install a modern heating plant in the Rose Hill school, Asheville township. Owing to the fact that the school will last for only one month more it was further decided that a more advisable plan would be to secure a larger stove for the remainder of this session, and then have the heating plant installed during the summer months when their work would not disturb the regular school classes.

AZALEA ROAD PAVING FINISHED YESTERDAY

PAVED ROAD TO AZALEA BY OTEEN HOSPITAL NOW.

Grading Work Being Pushed on the Asheville-Black Mountain Highway—To Pave in Spring.

The work of paving the Azalea road from the end of the concrete paving to Alex Porter's place, connecting with the concrete road there which extends to Azalea station, was completed yesterday and thrown open to travel. This means that one of the worst roads in the county has now been made one of the best, and travelers from Asheville can go to Bltmore, to Oteen hospital and on to Azalea station over a road as good as any paved street in the city.

The work was done by the Asheville Paving company, and is of asphalt over the old macadam base. The company first filled in the holes on the macadam base, making the surface smooth and then put a concrete curb on each side. The center is of asphalt, rolled to several inches thickness. For many months the road from the end of the old concrete paving to Oteen hospital was so bad that people dreaded to pass there.

This is one of the stretches on the Asheville-Black Mountain highway, the grading of which is now going on. As soon as the grading is completed the Asheville Paving company will pave the road. The contract calls for a concrete base with an asphalt surface, which it is believed, will make one of the best roads in the county, if not in the state. The grading contractors hope to complete their work during the spring, and just as soon as it is finished the paving contractors will begin their work, which will probably last the majority of next summer. In many instances the bad grades have been eliminated

and curves have been changed, until the new road will show a great improvement in location over the present road.

NEW YEAR'S DANCE LARGELY ATTENDED

A popular informal New Year's dance was given at the Elk's Club building on New Year's Eve, under the direction of the house manager, John O'Neil, and his committee of arrangements, Mrs. Iola Miller, Mrs. Eunice Robey and Miss Ruth Howell. The popularity of the dance was such that it is hoped this will not be the last of a series to be held at weekly intervals.

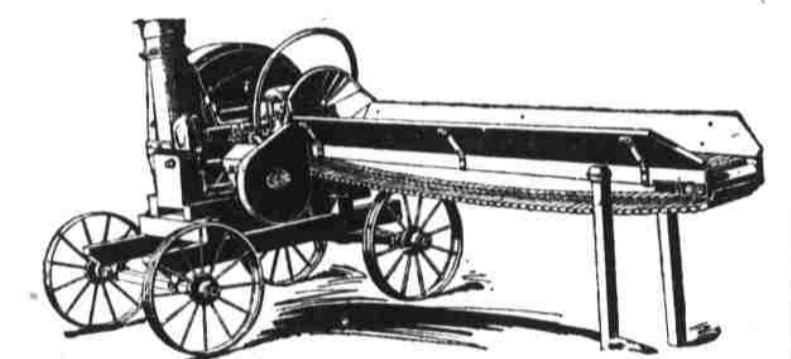
