**MASONIC MINSTRELS TO BE GIVEN FEB. 23**

CONTRACT SIGNED WITH CHICAGO PRODUCTION CO.

Rehearsals to Begin 15 Days Before Performance—First Show by Masons in Two Years.

The Masonic minstrels will come to life again, and on February 23, will give a performance at the city Auditorium. A contract has just been signed between a committee representing the local Masons and Joe Brem Production company, of Chicago, whereby the Chicago company furnishes all equipment, including scenery, makeup, directs rehearsals and everything else, except furnish the talent.

The local Masons did not give a minstrel in 1917 and 1918 owing to the war and the condition immediately after the armistice, but before that time the minstrels were always one of the popular attractions of the theatrical season and record crowds always attended.

Rehearsals will be started 15 days before the date of the minstrel and nightly meetings will be held in order to rush the work through. It is believed that the approaching performance will be the best the local Masons have ever staged. Owing to the large increase in membership there will be a greater selection for the members of the cast.

**RAILROAD MEN PLAY GOOD SAMARITAN**

Food and Lodging Secured for Family From Murphy Branch.

Three big-hearted men, two locomotive engineers and a brakeman, Saturday afternoon played Good Samaritan to a poor family, found by them in a pitiful condition in the waiting room of the Southern Railway station. The men state that the family consisted of a man, his wife and two little children, who were enroute from their home on the Murphy branch to South Carolina, where they planned to get work in a cotton mill.

Arriving here they were without funds or food and had planned to spend the night in the waiting room of the depot. Found there, after they had waited for several hours, the railroad men took the family to a nearby hotel, gave them supper and paid for rooms for them for the night and arranged for them to get a train out yesterday morning for their destination.

**SHRINERS TO FORM CLUB ON JAN. 13**

Club Will Be Started Off With Big Dance, To Be Given at the Masonic Temple.

Local Shriners are to have a Shrine club, a meeting for this purpose having been called for Tuesday, January 13, at the Masonic temple on Broadway. It is planned to form the club, select a name, elect officers and adopt rules and regulations for the governing of same, at this meeting.

The club will be social in its nature, similar to the Red Fox club of the Charlotte shriners and will be one of the few shrine clubs of the state. There are several hundred shriners in Asheville and western North Carolina, who would be eligible to join such a club and it is believed that the club will meet with great success.

The club will be started off with a shrine dance, to be given at the temple on Jan. 13. Details of the dance will be worked out during the next few days and it is expected that scores of shriners, with members of their families will be in attendance on that night. The local shriners have felt the need of such a club, as will be organized, for some time, and now that the movement is launched, will be received with interest by many.

These men were lieutenants in artillery outfits of the "Wildcat" division, and volunteered early, going to the first officers' training camp at Fort Oglethorpe. They have excellent records as overseas soldiers and their being commissioned as officers of the cavalry troop will meet the approval of those who have already enlisted in the organization.

Captain L. M. Fitzpatrick, who was captain of the old Asheville company during the world war became Company B, 115 Machine Gun Battalion, of the 39 Division, and who was wounded overseas, was commissioned captain of the new cavalry troop here and has already made considerable progress toward the reorganization of a national guard outfit for Asheville.

These three ranking officers of Troop B, are all Asheville boys and are well known and admired as soldiers. The success of the reorganization of the Asheville cavalry company is assured by the appointment of the lieutenants who will now as-

ist Captain Fitzpatrick in rapidly recruiting the company to full strength.

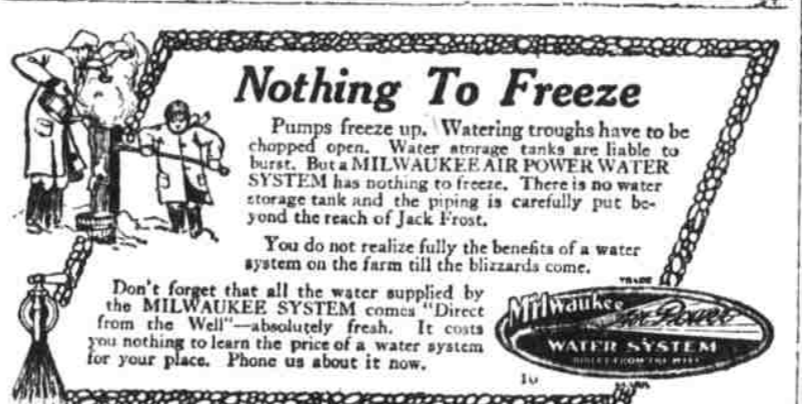
