

HICKORY POST-AMERICAN LEGION TO HAVE BUILDING

Propose Erecting Three-Story Structure to Be Used as Community Hall.

(Special to The Citizen.)
HICKORY, Jan. 29.—Plans for the erection of a permanent home for Hickory post No. 48, American legion, have progressed so far that the full membership has been called to meet Thursday night to take action on a proposition now being worked out by a committee appointed at a meeting of the executive committee.

Dr. H. C. Meulles, George L. Lysterly and Earl N. Carr comprise the committee.

It is proposed to erect a building three stories high, which will contain reading room, library, assembly room, gymnasium, shower baths, bowling alleys and other features. The building will be primarily for the home of the local post, but will be accessible to the entire city for public meetings and other gatherings. It will be a community building, members hope, and they propose to do their share towards obtaining it.

Sites and options and costs will be considered by the committee and submitted to the full meeting of the members. The project would be financed by a local stock company and if the plans mature, and prominent business men say they will help to mature them, the building will fill a want that has been felt here for years.

Rev. C. R. W. Kegley, pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran church, has been advised that his congregation by unanimous vote increased his salary from \$1,800 to \$2,400 a year. In point of members, this is one of the largest churches in this section and financially is able to put over the increase in good style.

MARION TRADE BODY AFTER TRAIN SCHEDULE CHANGE

Board of Trade Endorses Fifty Million Bond Issue for Central Highway.

(Special to The Citizen.)
MARION, Jan. 29.—The board of directors of the Marion board of trade met today in the dining room of the McDowell hotel and went on record as favoring the change of schedule so as to have passenger train go south to leave Marion at 8 a. m., connecting with train No. 36 from Asheville, which arrives at Marion at 7:45. This change, it is believed, would greatly accommodate Marion citizens desiring to go to Rutherfordton and points south and returning during the same day.

This was a very interesting session of the board of trade. A resolution was passed endorsing a \$50,000,000 bond issue for a central highway, and much enthusiasm was manifested relative to the speedy construction of the hard surface highway across McDowell county, which is McDowell's part of the central highway and which is supposed to pass through Hickory, Morganton, Marion and Swannanoa gap to Asheville.

The January term of superior court, which began January 13, with Judge J. B. Ray, who exchanged with Judge B. F. Long, presiding, closed today. Many interesting cases were disposed of and much business was transacted. This is Judge Ray's second time to hold court at Marion and the local bar and the court officials have expressed themselves as being highly pleased with his manner of holding court. The criminal term of McDowell starts February 16 and Judge Ray will also hold that term, having exchanged with Judge Long.

Among out-of-town attorneys who have attended court here this session were Judge Councill and M. G. Yount, of Hickory; E. M. Hairfield, of Morganton; Mr. Yates, of Detroit; and Mr. F. B. Hendren, of North Wilkesboro.

PAYNE EXPLAINS DELAY IN ACTION ON VESSELS

Would Make Certain That Fair Market Price Will Be Obtained.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—Delay on the part of the shipping board in taking action on the bids submitted for the purchase of the 30 former German passenger ships was said by Chairman Payne tonight to be due primarily to the board's intention to make certain that a fair market price will be obtained for each vessel before bids are accepted.
