SPUR NOT FEASIBLE MULVANEY ASSERTS

Superintendent of Southern Says Would Damage Considerable Business Property.

"The plan of having a sidetrack of the Southern railroad up South-side avenue to Oates park has never been brought to my attention and I do not consider the plan feasible," S. J. Mulvaney, superintendent of the Asheville division stated yesterday when asked in regard to the proposed spur.

Mr. Mulvaney asserted that the spur would be built by his department and if the matter was being handled with Southern officials it would eventually come back to his office for information and other data concerning the construction.

When asked in regard to the possibilities for railroad frontage houses, Mr. Mulvaney expressed the opinion that the warehouse to be erected by the Brown Hardware company at Biltmore would be a forerunner of warehouse development in that section.
