END CAMPAIGN FOR GREATER CHAMBER OF COMMERCE HERE WITH MEETING ON THURSDAY

An epoch in civic pride and spirit was reached last week in the drive for a Greater Asheville Chamber of Commerce for Asheville. The campaign has progressed far beyond all expectations.

Woolen Goods Designs Are Vivid And Large

White is to be the leading ground color or base in the woollens for the spring season.

The influence of white is in evidence in the grounds of fine Scotch woollens for skirts, capes, coats and outing suits.

Generally speaking the stripes comprise a medley of high sports colors and invariably each alternates with white, so that the general appearance is about 80 per cent of white with 20 per cent appointed to vivid colors.

Nevertheless, block plaids carry the flag for striking effects, since white grounds measuring 8, 10 or 12 inches square are bordered with blocks made up of high tones of the primary colors—blue, red and yellow—together with the secondary—green, orange and violet.

Broken colors, too, are chosen, such as amber, chartreuse, nasturtium pink, yellow reds and so on. But in forming a mental picture of the color effects, do not forget that only the high tones of the various colors are chosen, and that white alternates with each color so that the effect as a whole is white, lighted up with tints in variety.

Heart is one exception. Naturally this was chosen for a decorative color, since white and scarlet form one of the most striking contrasts known to colorists.

RETURN NEGRO TO AUGUSTA TODAY

Worked Here Nearly Two Years Before Identified as Man Wanted in Georgia on Murder Charge

After working in Asheville, unknown and unthought, for nearly two years, George Williams, negro wanted in Augusta, Ga., will be returned to that city this morning, where he faces a charge of murder in connection with the killing in the Fall of 1920 of a negro named Carrie Black.

Arrested by the local police, Williams confessed to part in the affray, they allege, but claimed he was not the one to commit the crime. According to his story, he was approached by a rival for her affections, and a knife fight ensued. In trying to separate the pair the negro received a fatal cut on the neck, but the other negro was the one responsible, Williams avers.

Advices from Augusta yesterday stated the killing occurred in Brownstone Park, a negro amusement place there. Search for Williams has been maintained by the Augusta police since that time.

CIRCUS WAYS BOOK ATTRACTS READERS

Al. G. Field's Biography, "Watch Yourself Go By," Is Also in Public Library.

The coming of the circus today suggests that library book of last year's shelving which has enjoyed a great degree of popularity relates to the circus. It is Conklin's The Ways of the Circus. All sorts of people read it and from various motives; out of curiosity, for information, for entertainment. It went along with Houdini's Miracle Mergers and Their Methods, a volume full of live interest and good information.

Al. G. Field has gone, but he left a biography which is in the library. Its title one might have expected of the minstrel, "Watch Yourself Go By." A good many people have read it—Asheville readers are fond of biography. Dewey's My Memories of 50 Years and M. E. Stone's Fifty Years a Journalist are late favorites, but Queen Victoria, Beveridge's Life of John Marshall and Margaret Asquith, yes, and The Education of Henry Adams are still high in favor.

It is not always the attractively titled novels which win the most favor locally. Such fiction as Le Quex's Secret Telephone, Ostrander's Nation's Arm, Beach's Flowing Gold and Sabatini's Captain Blood are suggestive in name, which The Forsyth Saga, The Head of the House of Coombe, One Man in His Time and DeLa Mare's Memoirs of a Midget are not. Yet these four rank high in favor.

THE modern coffee pot, as part of the silver service, displays a familiar shape and form. But coffee pots were not ever thus. The earliest were of cylindrical form, with wooden handles—somewhat like the kitchen coffee-pot. Later, they showed the characteristics of the contemporary tea pot, with shaped sides, like inverted pears, sharply receding to the pedestal. A more recent form resembled the late shaped tankards; and in the early nineteenth century occurred melon-shaped pots, which have survived in the modern crockery tea-pots.

To go back to our introduction, the graceful silver coffee-pot of today is a familiar figure as part of the silver service, without which no home is completely equipped. There are a number of minor variations, according to the design of the service. If you are interested, we shall take pleasure in showing our very charming patterns.
