### BILL FOR NEW FEDERAL BUILDING IN ASHEVILLE MAY GET CONSIDERATION

With dispatches yesterday from The Citizen's Washington Bureau to the effect that Representative Dell, majority leader of the House of Representatives, has informed President Harding that he will ask for the passage of a Public Building Bill, interest in being aroused in the campaign for a new Federal Building in Asheville.

It was recently announced by Representative Zebulon Weaver that Asheville was first on the list, should a Public Building Bill be passed and the hopes are bright.

A short time ago a campaign was launched for a new Federal Building in Asheville and it was stated that a committee would probably be sent to Washington to ask for an appropriation for this city as

soon as the bill was started on the move through the House.

The Citizen's dispatch stated that Representative John Langley, chairman of the committee on buildings and grounds has added that he would make the appropriation \$100,000,000. This fits in with plans of the postmaster general, who would stop renting buildings for postoffices and buy or build them.

If the program announced is carried out, public buildings bills introduced by Representative Weaver for Asheville, Canton, Franklin, Rutherfordton, Sylva and Tryon, will have consideration.

North Carolina would get a number of new buildings under the proposed legislation, the dispatch continues.

### CENTRAL BANK HAS OVER FIVE MILLION

DEPOSITS \$5,152,091 ON SEPTEMBER 15.

Combined Resources of Banking and Trust Departments Over Six Million Dollars.

The Central Bank and Trust Company has passed the five million mark and the deposits at the close of business September 15, were \$5,152,091.40, with combined resources of the trust and banking departments, \$6,215,973.66.

A gain in deposits of \$595,432.21 since the last statement, June 30, is reported and a gain of \$1,465,094.77 in the past year. The bank has a capital stock of \$100,000 and surplus and profits of \$117,119.67.

Furniture and fixtures of the banking house are valued at \$68,317.53 and the quarters among the most attractive in the city.

A number of improvements have been made since the last statement and the progress in new equipment and convenient arrangement equals the increase in deposits.

One of the additional features is a central telephone station, with trunk lines to the bank and branch lines to all departments. The bank now occupies the entire first floor of the Legal Building.

Officers are: Charles W. Brown, Chairman of Board and Trust Officer; Wallace E. Davis, president; W. R. Oates, vice-president; Russell C. Davis, cashier; Charles A. Taylor, assistant cashier; G. G. Connelly, assistant cashier and J. Chas. Bradford, assistant cashier. The bank is a United States, State, County and City depository.
