

## FIRE PREVENTION CAMPAIGN TO EDUCATE PUBLIC BEGINS TOMORROW ON WIDER SCALE

On a more extensive scale than ever before attempted, the annual educational fire prevention campaign will be launched tomorrow morning, with an address at 10 o'clock at the Asheville Normal school by Mayor Gallatin Roberts. In the past only the grammar schools and the High School have been included in the campaign, but this year the plans of Fire Chief L. Duckett call for lectures and demonstrations at various industrial plants in addition.

The introduction of a demonstration of how to turn in a fire alarm is a new feature. Chief Duckett will have charge of this. He has a small stand on which is mounted a fire alarm box like

those over the city, and will demonstrate how to turn in the alarm, and what happens at the fire station when this is done.

Speakers for the series of lectures will be Mayor Roberts; R. L. Fitzpatrick, Commissioner of Public Safety; James H. Wood, President of the North Carolina State Firemen's Association; Chief Duckett; Miss Evelyn Lee, of the State Fire Insurance Department at Raleigh; R. L. Spalding, Special Fire Insurance Agent; D. H. Hiden Ramsey, and others.

Industrial plants already "lined up" for one or more of the lectures and demonstrations are Hans-Rees Tannery, Asheville Cotton Mills, the three laundries, the Asheville Power and Light Company, and other institutions in the city will also be visited.

After these have all been visited the High School, and grammar schools will hear lectures.

## ENDOWMENT FUND IN MEMORY OF MAYNARD

Mayor Pleased to Aid in Cause as Memorial to "Only Aviator With Whom He Ever Flew."

"I shall contribute to the fund, for he is the only aviator with whom I have ever flown." The words are those of Mayor Gallatin Roberts in reference to the receipt of notice of action taken by Wake Forest to perpetuate the memory of Belvin W. Maynard, familiarly known as the "Flying Parson."

Aviator Maynard, whose untimely death recently by a sudden fall in his plane shocked and distressed thousands who knew him, caused a sensation in Asheville and vicinity some months ago by his daring exploits in his machine. He carried a large number for short joy flights during the several days of his visit in Asheville.

The message accompanying the announcement of the Endowment Fund Committee organization follows: "Wake Forest College, the alma mater of Belvin W. Maynard, world famous aviator, familiarly known and beloved by thousands as the "Flying Parson," will perpetuate his name in the college annals by establishing two memorials: First, a bronze tablet to be placed in the College Chapel. Second, a living memorial in the form of a scholarship fund to bear his name, the interest of which will be used to help worthy young men of limited means—with special preference to those from his birthplace, Sampson County—to obtain a college education.

The faculty has appointed a special committee consisting of Prof. Hubert Jones, Dr. Charles P. Weaver, and Dr. J. W. Nowell to receive and administer the fund. The goal set by the committee is given as \$2,500.

## BAPTISTS PLANNING PROGRESSING WORK

ADOPT NEW PLAN OF ORGANIZATION

Heads of Various Departments to Appoint Assistant and Leaders in Each Group.

A new plan of organization for the carrying on of the work of the Buncombe County Baptist Sunday School Association was adopted last night at a meeting of the Workers Council at the office of John H. Grogg, the President, 73 Patton Avenue.

It was unanimously decided that one of the best ways to accomplish results was for each of the superintendents of adult work, teacher training, stewardship and missions, music, elementary work and improvement and extension to each select an assistant. This will make 12 instead of six, to look after the work. Each superintendent will also select a group assistant in each of the seven groups, making 42 more. These will organize and elect a president, secretary and treasurer. Then the group assistants will visit the churches in their community and select the church assistants to represent each of the superintendents. This will make six in each church or 402 in the 67 churches in the County.

October 29 was selected as the day to hold nine Fifth Sunday Institutes at the following churches: Big Ivy, Weaverville, Zion Hill, White Rock, New Salem, Chunn's Cove, Black Mountain, French Broad at Alexander, and Round Hill, near Leicester.

## SUCCESSFUL CAMPS IN FIRE-FIGHTING

Upward of 50 Wardens, U. S. and State, Gather to Learn Latest Methods.

Through the fact that the initial forest fire of the dry or "fire season" has already occurred in Rutherford County, burning about three acres last week before Wardens succeeded in putting out the flames, makes the more interesting reports received of successful sessions held by the U. S. Forest Service men in conducting fire-fighting schools at Old Fort, the Pink Beds, and Edgemont. Upward of 50 attended the three schools on September 28 and 27.

Latest methods of fighting forest fires, uses of well established and new tools, preparation of back-firing trenches and other problems connected with the fighting of fires were taken up, all

present showing great interest in the demonstrations. Under the leadership of M. A. Mattoon, the Old Fort Camp had 20 members taking instruction. Representatives of the U. S. Forest Service and State Wardens were present to study the same problems and to learn each other by name. State Wardens present were Dewey G. Brown, R. C. Nance, both from McDowell County; Garland B. Stepp, of Black Mountain, and Thomas Branch, of Burke County.

At the Pink Beds Camp, Ira Yarnell in charge, 15 men were present. Nat L. Burgess, of Haywood; Riley McCall, of Transylvania; J. P. Whitaker, of Hender-

son; Will E. Fletcher and T. W. Maney, of Buncombe, were the State Wardens in attendance. At all the camps the State representatives present were Wardens whose territory joins that guarded by U. S. Fire Wardens. Reports from the Edgemont Camp, conducted by Vernon Rhoades, Supervisor of the Pisgah Forest, show that 14 men attended that school. The Supervisor had not reached Asheville on Thursday, returning for the Camp session.

In connection with the efforts to train Wardens how effectively to combat fires in the forests, a campaign of publicity by which the citizens will be led to think

twice before setting fires unintentionally is planned by the U. S. Forest Service here.
