W. L. Stoddart, New York ar chitect, who has been engaged by the Citizen Hotel Corporation for the new George Vanderbilt Hotel, is also architect for the home of the Bon Marche, which will be one of the finest in the State and will probably be ready for occupancy within six months, accord-

ting to present plans.

The building will face on Haywood Street, with side entrances on Battery Park Drive, space being reserved for widening this property as recently stated in an announcement by Mr. Grove, when he outlined temporary plans for development of this large tract in the heart of the business district for commeralal purposes.
