NO THIRD PARTY.

THE CONFERENCE OF STATE ALLIANCE PRESIDENTS OPPOSE IT.

[Roanoke News]

At a convention of the several State Alliances held in Washington City last week the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, That it is the sentiment and desire of this conference of the presidents of the Farmers Alliance and Industrial Union that the delegates for the F. A. and I. U. who attend the industrial conference to be held in St. Louis, February, 22, 1892, use their influence and votes to establish and perfect fraternal relations with the labor organizations represented in said meeting, with the Ocala demands as a basis for a platform of principles, and that such platform be presented to the National conventions of the Democratic party, the Republican and the People's parties, this with an earnest request that the principles involved be engrafted into their platforms for the coming national elections of 1892. But that they carefully refrain from committing our order as such to an affiliation with any political party or parties."

The conference was presided over by President Polk, with W. F. Gynne, as Secretary. A memorial to Congress has been adopted, which deprecates the agricultural depression, and asserts that it is due mainly to partial and unfriendly legislation. It is claimed that present financial system is defective, that all money should be issued directly by the government to the people at a low rate of interest and in sufficient volume to meet legitimate demands, and that silver should have all the coinage, and the qualities of legal tender that gold possesses.
