U. who attend the industrial conference to be held in St. Louis, February, 22, 1892, use their influence and votes to establish and perfect fraternal relations with the labor organizations represented in said meeting, with the Ocala demands as a basis for a platform of principales, and that such platforn be presented to the National conventions of the Democratic party, the Republican and the l'eople's parties, this with an earnest request that the principles involved be engrafted into their platforms for the coming national elections of 1892. But that they carefully refrain from committing our order as such to an affiliation

The conference was presided over by President Polk, with W. F. Gynne, as Secretary.
