P.ceedings of Commissioners Camden County. CAMDEN C. H., N. C. Oct 1, 1900. Board of County Commissioners met to day. Present—E. M. DeFord Chm, Joo S McCoy and C. P. Wright.

Proceedings of last meeting read and adopted. W S Barthol, Sheriff was allowed \$51.26 for court costs. W H Abbot, J. E. was allowed \$13.10 for fees in cases of state vs C. O. Spencer and Heyward Brown. E. B. Gallop was allowed \$1.00 for services as Election Bailiff at Shiloh Precinct. Josiah Webb was allowed \$2.10 for constable fees in case of State vs. Haywood Brown.

Ordered, That the Reg. of Deeds deliver the 1900 tax books to the Sheriff for collection. M. B. Hughes was allowed \$26.10 for Jailers fees and court costs. R. L. Forbes was allowed \$37.43 for court costs. Benj. Dunford was allowed \$12.50 as keeper of Alms House. Nancy Beads was allowed \$2.00 as benefit. Betsey Etheridge was allowed \$2.00 as benefit.

The Treasurer submitted county orders and jury tickets to the amount of \$347.38 of which \$49.10 were jury tickets, said orders being cancelled and receipt given for same. The auditing committee submitted their report, which was read and ordered to be recorded. The report showed that the Sh'ff had settled in full for county and school funds for 1899 taxes. The following reports of the Grand Jury and Solicitor for the Fall term were read and ordered to be recorded. "We the Grand Jurors for the State respectfully report to the Honorable Court: That we have examined the Court House, Jail and Poor House and find them in fair condition. Sept. 14 1900 E. K. Sawyer, Foreman Grand Jury. North Carolina, Supr. Court, Camden County, Fall Term 1900. I have examined the office of Clerk of Superior Court of said County at this term and find same together with his books in good condition and well kept. G. W. Ward, Sept. 14 1900. Solicitor. Ordered, That C. B. Garrett be allowed \$100.72 for extending tax lists for 1900, recording Election Returns, & etc. C. S. Sawyer was allowed \$3.21 for supplies to Alms House. Board adjured to meet the first Monday in November. E. M. DeFord Ch'm C. B. Garrett, Clerk.
