We hereby suggest that a meet ing of our good people be held, at the Court House, on Friday, the 3rd. iụst., at 8:30 o'clock, P. M. The Ccurt House bell will be rung at that time to remind everyone of his duty. The registıation books are not closed until Saturday night of the 4th. inst. at 9 o'elock P. M. Therefore, let all register who are entitled to do so. Let us at least do our whole duty, even though defeated.

## THE CHANCE OF THE FUSIONISTS
