Error Found in Imposition of Fine and Sentence on Thos. Shipman

RALEIGH, Oct. 19.—The state supreme court today allowed the state's motion to docket and dismiss the appeals from denial of a new trial in the cases of Thomas Shipman, J. H. Fieckelmeier, C. R. McNeeley and Ralph Fisher in the Transylvania county banking cases, growing out of the close of the Brevard Banking company. It also allowed the state's motions dismissing appeals of Wallace B. Davis, of Asheville, and of Luke Lea and Luke Lea, Jr., in the conspiracy case in connection with the affairs of the Central Bank and Trust company, and also that of Davis in which he is under conviction for the issuance of a false report on the condition of Central Bank and Trust company.
