Brevard Loses Close Game To Heavy Aggregation of Franklin High Players

The Franklin High team downed Brevard Friday afternoon on the local gridiron, 8 to 0. The local boys were outplayed all during the game until the last period when they threatened twice to score. Franklin scored early in the first quarter after a 22 yard gain by Cabe, quarterback. McCullen went over the line for the tally. A short pass failed on the extra point.

Then in the third period Clayton attempted to punt but it was blocked. Brevard covered behind their goal line, making safety and scoring two points for the visitors.

Lance, center for the Blue Devils, was an outstanding linesman while Morris showed good work in the backfield. Dowdle, Franklin's captain, and center, displayed brilliant defensive work, and McCullen, half back, did well by averaging 5 yards each time he carried the ball.

Brevard's passing attack did not function as it did last season for 10 passes were tried and only two completed, which netted them 31 yards. Franklin made two good and gained 28 yards by them.

Franklin marked up 210 yards from scrimmage while Brevard's line players gained only 71 yards.

Brevard punted 5 times, one was blocked while the other four averaged

39 yards. The visitors kicked 3 times and averaged 28 yards. The home team made 5 first downs to the visitors 13.
