Extra Fine Program and Good Meal Enjoyed By Over Hundred People

ROSMAN, Dec. 5.—Young Tar Heel Farmers of the Rosman high school were hosts to fathers and a number of invited guests at the banquet room of the school Tuesday night of last week in one of the most enjoyable affairs of the school year.
A program that was interesting, instructive and well given lent itself to making a success of the father-son event, furthered by an appetizing meal prepared and served by members of the Home Economics class. Practically all foods served were home grown, the following menu being served: Fruit cocktail, fried chicken, gravy, candied sweet potatoes, string beans, hot rolls, butter, mashed potatoes, pickles, cabbage salad, ice cream, coffee cake, mints, and peanuts.

Four-leaf programs in the shape of an ear of corn and the unique place cards and favor baskets were all hand made and displayed artistic talent. The room was appropriately decorated with emblems of the chapter, with backgrounds of farm products and mountain growths.
E. J. Whitmire, president of the chapter, presided over the meeting, the welcome address being given by Ted Harbin. L. V. Sigmon, county commissioner and county accountant, responded to the address of welcome. The Rev. J. E. Burt, pastor of Rosman Baptist church gave the invocation, followed by music by the East Fork string band which also furnished music throughout the evening.

Several members of the Rosman chapter took part on the varied program. President Whitmire speaking briefly on "What Vocational Agriculture Has Meant To Me," and Warren Case telling of the trip taken by the boys this summer to White Lake. Projects were discussed by Warren Case and the matter of wheat reduction as it affects farmers in Transylvania county was intelligently discussed by Russell Duncan, who stressed the point that local farmers would do well to sow sufficient wheat for home consumption in face of the inevitable rise that is still to come in the price of flour, this to be added to the already proportionately high prices that became effective with the process tax era.

Initiation of 13 "green hands" into the chapter was in itself a revelation of the aims and ideals of the farmer organization in the local school, officers of the chapter giving this part of the program in excellent manner.

After completion of the regular program and the partaking of the fine food, Professor Randall Lyday, teacher of the agriculture class, introduced the following guests:
