they will again take their places as leaders in the affairs of our county. We commend the honest and loyal service these men have rendered Transylvania county.

We deplore the fact that the wives and families of these men are being forced to endure great suffering on account of the unjust punishment placed upon them and pledge to them our cooperation in their efforts to carry on under these trying circumstances, and commend them for going forward under the full knowledge that the men are innocent and have not lost any of the confidence and respect of the citizens of Transylvania county.

The records of the county commissioners of Transylvania county reveal that in compliance with an order of Judge Townsend made at the December Term 1932, of the superior Court of Transylvania, these men did on December 24, 1932, pay into the board of county commissioners of Transylvania county the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars, which funds have remained with the county commissioners since that date and are still in the possession of the county of Transylvania and these men are being compelled to suffer the penalty of both fine and imprisonment when the Supreme court of North Carolina in this case declared that it was contrary to law, and in addition thereto, two judges of the Supreme Court of North Carolina have declared in written opinion that there was no evidence of any crime having been committed by these men. We deplore the fact that innocent men in North Carolina may be required to suffer such unusual and unjust punishment and are required to serve a sentence in the state prison after having paid a fine in the same cause.

Lewis P. Hamlin was made chairman of the convention at the request of Roscoe L. Nicholson, chairman of the executive committee, and A. E. Hampton was named secretary.

Following election of delegates who are to serve at the state, congressional, senatorial and judicial conventions, Mr. Hamlin made the keynote speech of the day, predicting that the state will go Republican in the election this fall and decried the status of state affairs under the Democratic regime which he termed nothing short of dictatorial. Organization of Republican clubs in each district was urged, one having already been organized at Rosman.

While our national government is providing inconceivable sums of money for AAA, CCC, PWA, CWA, TVA and others, it should provide at least \$400,000,000 from the federal treasury to be disbursed through state departments of education in order to meet the present emergency need and rescue the schools from imminent breakdown.

Our great need at present, as all unprejudiced, impartial, patriotic observers fully realize, is a more effective system of education "made to click with life," evenly distributed, professionally administered, adequately supported, keenly sensitive to its responsibility, and in touch with present social needs. Education and national welfare are so interdependent that one is inconceivable without the other.

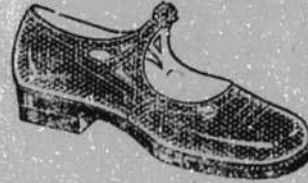

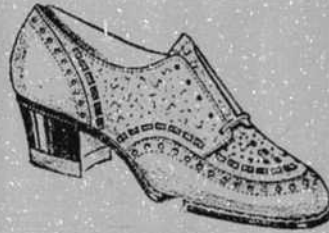
