One measure of the broad program that was started in 1933 remains to be completed by congress. This is a corporation bankruptcy bill which would extend to them provisions similar to those that already have been granted individuals, farmers, railroads and municipalities. lin the country.

In general, the plan allows these types of debtors to scale down their obligations with the consent of twothirds of their creditors and federal

court approval.

Under the measure signed last week, a little town or metropolis may with the consent of 51 per cent of the holders of its outstanding obligations take a refinancing plan to the district

If the court finds it equitable, and 75 per cent of the creditors then agree the refinancing or scaling down of the municipality's debts may be carried out.

Aid To Debt-Ridden Cities Proponents of the legislation said this would prevent a minority of the creditors from keeping a town or city hopelessly in the red by refusing to accept any debt adjustment as they may do at masser.

may do at present. Opponents contended it would ruin the municipal bond market by making investors fearful of the stability of such obligations.
