"How did it happen, Goodness, I don't know," said Gilmore Thompson, one of the boys who was brought to Brevard when questioned about the accident. "All I know was we were going too fast. There were lots of boys on the truck, pretty well jammed up, but I could tell it was too fast for that crooked road and down-hill, too.

"I didn't see the curve we were coming to, and the first thing I knew the whole bunch was sailing through the air, all mixed together with legs and arms and boys all together. All of us didn't hit together, though," young Thompson said, "some of the boys being thrown way on down below me, and some of them were half under the truck.

"I sort of lost track for a moment," the sixteen-year-old chap said, "and then began helping get some of the other boys out from under the truck; but we were all pretty sick and some of us fell was didn't know anything. It was awful, blood all around, some of the little boys crying and groaning and for a little bit most of them looked like they were dead. It wasn't long until there were lots of folks there and then I lay down on the side of the road until the truck came along and brought us over to the hospital. But it was awful, I tell you," the young chap said.

All the boys that were brought to Lyday Memorial hospital, seemed cheerful when they were told that "the father" was they called the doctor. Father de Vineau, was thought to be all O. K. All seemed very anxious about Father de Vineau and no one seemed to have the heart to tell the youngsters that their leader had been killed instantly.
