J. B. ARLEDGE DIED AT HENDERSONVILLE

HENDERSONVILLE, Oct. 10—J. B. Arledge, aged 80, died at his home here Sunday night after an illness of several years.

He had been very active in this section, having served as chief of police of Hendersonville, clerked in several stores here and served one term as register of deeds. He is believed to have been the first Democrat to hold office in Henderson county after the War Between the States.

The wife, who survives him, was the former Miss Marie Gillespie of Brevard.

HENDERSONVILLE, Oct. 10—M. G. Johnson, 47, Hendersonville merchant, died at 10 o'clock Tuesday night at his home here. He had been ill three weeks.

He was a brother of Mrs. C. O. Robinson, of Brevard, and a son of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Johnson. Funeral services will be held at the Methodist church here Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Mr. Johnson was a native of Hendersonville, and had been in business for the past 20 years. He was a member of the board of stewards of the First Methodist Episcopal church and belonged to the Woodmen of the World.

Surviving Mr. Johnson are his widow; three daughters, Mrs. Warren Stokes and Misses Elizabeth and Betty Jane Johnson, of Hendersonville; three sons, Manual, Van Bruce, and Jack Johnson, all of Hendersonville; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Johnson, Sr.; three sisters, Mrs. T. F. Lofitt, of Hendersonville; Mrs. C. O. Robinson, of Brevard; and Mrs. Florida Bailey, of Asheville; and three brothers, Fillie D. Johnson, of New York City, C. E. Johnson, of Asheville, and A. J. Johnson, of Morganton.

FATHER OF BREVARD MAN BURIED IN N. J.

Irving W. Wyatt, father of Howard Wyatt of Brevard, died Sunday morning, September 30, at the home of his son in Irvington, N. J. Funeral services were held on Tuesday.

Mr. Wyatt, aged 86, was a retired real estate and lumber dealer of Newark, N. J., where he lived for 40 years, later moving to Irvington. He was born in Erie, Pa. When a child his family moved by covered wagon to the state of Wisconsin where he was high sheriff. He at one time wrote a letter to the then President Hoover, in which he predicted the administration of the incoming President Roosevelt, many of which predictions have come true to date.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Martha S. Wyatt, and three sons, Howard, of Brevard; Halsey, of Irvington; Bradley, of Kearney, and one daughter, Miss Marjorie Wyatt, of Irvington.
