Capt. Lee Conley has recently been promoted to the rank of captain at the armed forces retraining and induction station, Baltimore, Md. He is a native of Brevard and attended the high school here. He entered the army in 1916, and after the first World

War he re-enlisted in 1923 at Harrisburg, Pa., and has served continuously since that time. He was commissioned a first lieutenant last September. Captain Conley lives with his family in Baltimore.

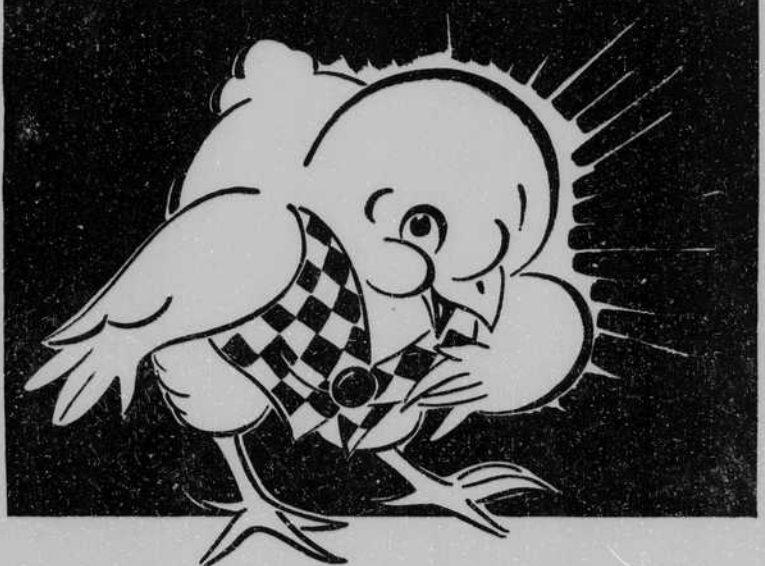
