

Housewives Urged To Save Waste Fats And Take To Meat Dealers

Dealers To Pay Three Cents A Pound, Need For Fats Is Stressed

An adequate supply of fats and oils is essential to winning a war and Transylvania county housewives and meat dealers have a desperately important job to do, according to a special release received this week by Salvage Chairman Howard Wyatt.

"The allied blockade, which shut off Germany's imports of fats and oils, was a major factor in her being defeated in World War I," the release stated.

"In 1941, the United States imported nearly two billion pounds of fats and oils, largely from the far east. Most of these sources are now in the hands of the Japs. It is imperative to us, as a nation, that we make up this loss and the salvaging of used cooking fats and greases offers our best opportunity.

"It has become desperately necessary for every housewife to save and turn in to her meat dealer every possible ounce of used cooking grease and for each meat dealer to do everything in his power to encourage his customers to do so," it was stressed.

The reason is because fats contain glycerine and glycerine is a vital ingredient of smokeless powder. The housewife, the meat dealer and the man behind the gun are a team. It is the urgent, patriotic duty of every housewife and every meat dealer to "pass the ammunition" in the form of waste kitchen fats, to make glycerine, to make gunpowder.

Local officers apprehended Alfred Gravelly, Brevard boy who had been absent from military service without leave for the past 40 days, and took him to Camp Croft.

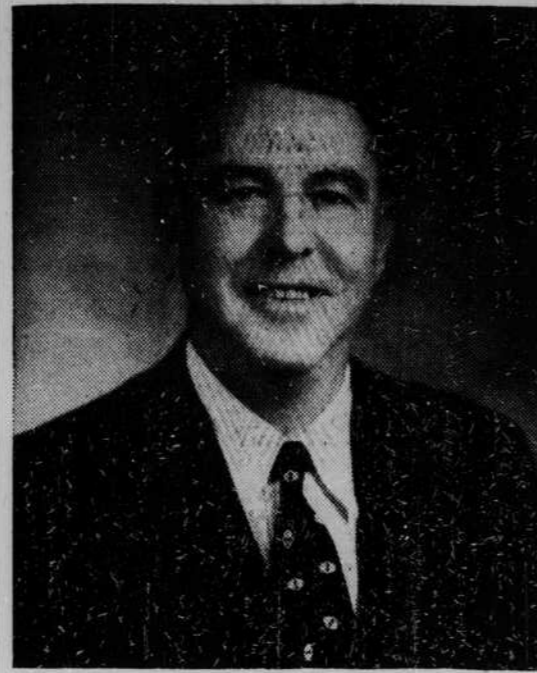
of waste fat each day, it would total over 360 million pounds a year, enough to make 540 million pounds of gunpowder.

They are paying three cents per pound.

Any kind of clean metal container can be used to save fats. It doesn't have to be a coffee or a shortening can. A fruit, vegetable or soup can is perfectly all right.

Rationing Of Canned Milk Ordered By OPA

WASHINGTON, — Rationing of canned milk was ordered Tuesday by OPA, acting without warning to conserve diminishing supplies for babies.

No actual restrictions were placed upon the purchase of evaporated and condensed milk for adult use, but canned milk will take red coupons, and most adults are expected to save coupons for meat, butter or cheese.

The point value was placed at one per pound which means that the common tall can, 14 1-2 ounces, will cost one point. The common small size, 6 ounces, will be two
