

A Warning Is Issued To Essential Employees In Transylvania County

Statements Of Availability Must Be Obtained Before Changing Jobs

A warning that workers in the Brevard area planning to get jobs elsewhere will not be hired without a statement of availability from the local office of the United States Employment Service was issued today by Carl Buchanan, manager of the Hendersonville office of the USES in discussing the new employment stabilization plan covering Region IV which includes North Carolina.

Mr. Buchanan called attention to provisions of the Region IV plan developed by representatives of labor and management which require that all workers whose most recent employment was in an essential activity must obtain a statement of availability from their present employer or the United States Employment Service before seeking other employment. He added that workers in activities other than essential do not need statements of availability unless they are planning to seek jobs outside the area.

The plan, which went into effect on May 15, places restrictions on inter-area migration and on hiring in order that workers will be provided where needed to do war production and essential civilian work. It is based upon War Manpower Commission regulations issued under President Roosevelt's "Hold-the-Line" Order stabilizing wages, prices, and employment, and the War Manpower Commission's national policy on Employment Stabilization.

"Workers in activities not designated as essential may be hired by employers engaged in essential activities without restriction, provided they work in the area where they are hired," Mr. Buchanan explained.

"When a worker desires to quit or to be transferred under the conditions outlined in the plan, he shall notify his employer of that

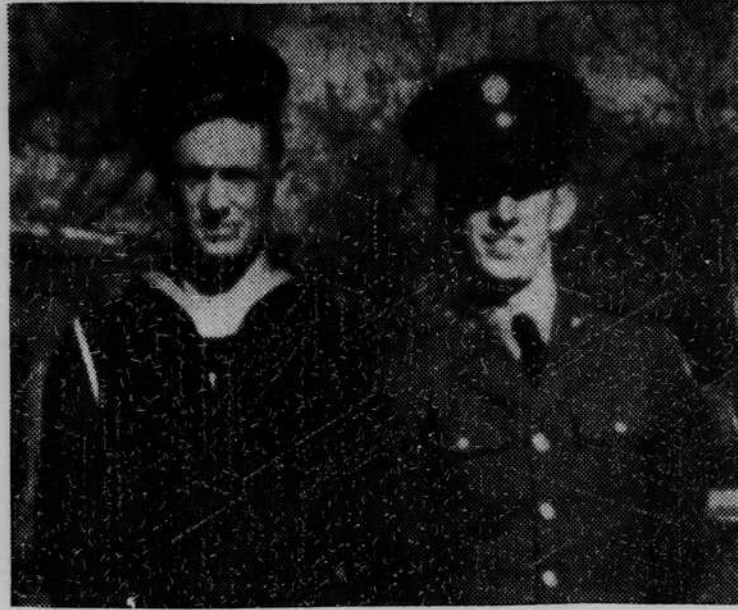

Classes At Brevard And Pisgah Forest To Close Tonight and Friday

When the home nursing classes that are being conducted in Brevard and Transylvania county are completed, there will be approximately 80 women who will receive certificates, it was learned from Miss Margaret Walker, National Red Cross representative who is teaching the classes. The class at Rosman closed last week and 12 women received certificates.

The Brevard class, which has been held here at the Brevard elementary school, ends tonight and around 18 to 20 persons are expected to finish.

The Pisgah Forest class closes Friday night and a total of approximately 20 will graduate.

Instruction of the course that is being given at Calvert-Cherryfield will terminate sometime next week. There are about 20 enrolled.

In the colored class here, a total of 25 are enrolled and these will graduate the latter part of the month.

"Interest here and in the county in our home nursing classes has been good and I would say that it is above the average," Miss Walker said.

Last Friday night the Pisgah Forest class enjoyed a picnic in the forest.

Miss Walker's schedule for the county is expected to terminate on July 5 and no new nursing classes have been planned.

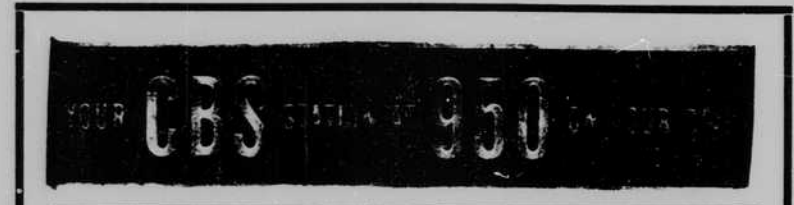
