## BOND HERE MON.

In Soliciting Labor For **Out-Of-State Work.** 

James Burl Zachary of Jackson county and a former lumber work er in this county, was bound over to the December term of Transylvania county superior court under bond of \$500 during a hearing held before Justice F. E. Shuford Monday in the courthouse here, on charges of violation of the state's employment laws.

Zachary was alleged to have been soliciting workers for a large lumber concern in the state of Washington. Several men who had been approached testified.

According to the state law, it is unlawful to solicit, hire or contract with laborers in this state for cap symin at of the state without obtaining a state license for the privilege of engaging in such business. The state license

costs \$500 and counties and towns may make a similar charge, too, if they desire. Persons convicted of violation of

his law must be fined not less than \$1000, according to the statute.



## PLAN IS APPROVED **BY TRUSTEES OF COLLEGE MONDAY**

To Renew Drive To Raise Funds For Building And Endowment Purposes.

## TO RAISE SALARIES

Plans for launching an extensive postwar expansion program at Brevard college were unanimously approved by the trustees at an annual meeting held here Tuesday afternoon.

The plans were presented by President Eugene J. Coltrane and provide for the erection of several buildings after the war and for the establishment of a substantial endowment fund.

An expansion movement was started here in the spring of 1941 and considerable progress was made in raising funds, but this program was interrupted when the Japs struck at Pearl Harbor.

In his appeal to the board Tuesday, Dr. Coltrane stressed the importance of renewing the movement immediately and declared that "now is the time to make definite plans for the future."


No specific amount of money was specified by the board Tuesday, as a goal for the proposed expansion program, but it is believed that it will exceed the \$425,000 objective Coltrane stated that a good increase in enrollment is anticipated after the war and urged that the plans be adequate to take care of

"Brevard college is a permanent, growing institution and we must plan now for the future," he asserted.


