

BREVARD COLLEGE HAS MANY LARGE, **MODERN BUILDINGS**

Situated In A Setting Of Beautiful Trees And Spacious Lawn.

There are four large brick buildings in the Brevard college unit, situated in a setting of beautiful shade trees and spacious, well-kept lawns.

Spencer Hall, the administration building, contains the offices, classrooms, laboratories, auditorium and library. The building has capacity to accomodate four hundred students.

The three dormitories are known as West Hall, Taylor Hall, and Frances Ross Hall. West Hall and Taylor Hall are occupied by women. All these buildings have steam heat, hot and cold water in lavatories and showers, and other modern conveniences. All dormitory rooms are furnished with single beds and each room has a dresser, table, and chairs. Special attention has been given to the lighting in the dormitory rooms. The dining room and kitchen are located in West Hall.

The college leases Virginia Lodge, a commodious resort hotel just off the campus, as a home for young women.
