

ED ANDERSON TO PRESIDE AT NEA MEET IN CHICAGO

Will Also Speak On Newsprint Outlook. Times Publisher Is Member Of WPB Board.

Ed M. Anderson, who was recently appointed chairman of the legislative committee of the National Editorial association, will preside at a meeting of the N. E. A. advisory council in Chicago this week end, and make plans to present testimony before the Senate Banking and Currency committee when hearings on the Bankhead bill are started on Tuesday, October 19th.

Mr. Anderson has the honor of being the first NEA legislative chairman appointed to this important position without having first served as president of the National Editorial association.

At the meeting in Chicago he will also speak on the newsprint outlook. Mr. Anderson represents the 10,000 non-daily newspapers of the nation on the advisory committee of the printing and publishing division of the War Production board and is a member of the WPB task committee which
