The citation was for ac-Douglas Philip Debrabant and Debrabant around July first with four other seamen who saved four men and stood by their respective guns until all enemy craft had scattered. Seaman Debrabant was credited with four out of eight enemy planes, thus saving from destruction one fleet of PT boats. He has been stationed at Great Lakes, Ill., and Gulfport, Miss., and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. P. C. Debrabant, of Brevard.
