FARM QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question: What are the methods for breaking the rest period of Irish potatoes to stimulate germination?

Answer: There are several methods employed in breaking the rest period: cold storage for several weeks; greening by spreading the potatoes in indirect light; and chemical treatment. Since fallcrop potatoes should be planted the latter part of July, the quickest method-chemical treatmentshould be used, says H. R. dewberries be sprayed in summer? Answer: By all means spray the new canes of both raspberries and dewberries to control diseases. Use commercially - prepared Bordeaux mixture according to the directions of the manufacturer as recommended for spraying other fruits.
