Only Democratic Judges Will Serve. Both Candidates Claim Victory


Music for the ball will be furnished by the Ecusta string band, and tickets may be secured from any member of the local police force at \$1.00 each.

Highway 276 from Brevard to Asheville has been resurfaced to he county line, and similar work has been started on highway 64 o Hendersonville. One crew of men is at the present time repairng the shoulders and clearing curves and ditches on the same oute and the work will be coninued through Brevard to Ros-

Major repair work is being done on the highway from Rosman to Lake Toxaway, and when completed, the highway will be considerably wider and a few dangerous curves eliminated, it is report-
