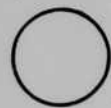

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER

- 1. To vote a straight party ticket, make a cross (X) mark in the circle of the party you desire to vote for. 2. To vote a mixed ticket, or in other words for candidates of different parties, either omit making a cross (X) mark in the party circle at the top and mark in the voting square opposite the name of each candidate on the ballot for whom you wish to vote or make a cross (X) in the party circle above the name of the party for some of whose candidates you wish to vote, and then mark in the voting squares opposite the names of any candidate of any other party for whom you wish to vote. 3. If you tear or deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it to the registrar and get another.

"SOCIAL SECURITY FACTS"

By D. W. Lambert, Manager Social Security Administration Field Office Asheville, N. C.

Find out about your old-age benefits under your old-age and survivors insurance.

When you are 65 years old, ask about the monthly retirement benefits you may be entitled to claim for yourself and qualified dependents.

Find out whether you are fully insured; when your wife will also become entitled to monthly benefits; how your benefits are

calculated; the amount of wages you may earn while receiving your monthly insurance payments—on jobs covered by the social security law—on other jobs.

The best place to get these important facts is the nearest social security office, but you may be able to learn much to your interest from your social security committee if your local union has such a committee in close touch with the social security office.

This may interest you: Local unions, employee groups, or any organization can arrange to have the manager of the social security office come to a regular or special meeting to discuss the old-age and survivors insurance program and answer members' questions.

A representative of the Asheville field office of the social security administration will be at the postoffice at 9:30 a. m. in Brevard on the third Monday each month.

Mars Hill College Has Four Enrolled From This County

Four students from Transylvania county are enrolled at Mars Hill college for the first semester, according to figures released from the registrar's office today.

These are Thomas Logan Hooper, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Hooper, Route 1; Perry Ransom Hamlin, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis P. Hamlin; Joseph Walter McGuire, Jr., son of Rev. and Mrs. J. N. McGuire, Route 2; and Richard Monroe Parris, son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Wilson Parris, all of Brevard.

A total of 933 students are enrolled at the college, 481 men and 452 women. These come from 87 counties of North Carolina, 20 states, British West Indies, Brazil, Hawaii, Cuba, and Portugal.

N. P. GALLOWAY IS NAMED CHAIRMAN OF FHA COMMITTEE

Warren Fisher And George Shuford To Serve With Rosman Man

Naaman P. Galloway, of Rosman, was elected chairman of the Farmers Home administration committee in Transylvania county. The other two members of the committee are Warren I. Fisher, of Lake Toxaway, and George D. Shuford, of Penrose. J. C. McDarris is county supervisor and has an office open here in the court house each Wednesday.

According to Mr. McDarris, money is now available for the purchase of family size farms, fertilizer, seed, livestock and other needs of eligible farmer applicants.

In establishing the Farmers Home administration, congress hoped to bring to the family size farms of America credit at a reasonable repayment schedule combined with the latest information in improved farm and home making. The law specifically states that a committee composed of three members shall pass on all applications and certify all loans as eligible.

Navy Day To Be Observed Oct. 30

Although there will be no official celebration of Navy Day, October 30, in Transylvania county, all local persons are invited to attend observances in Asheville.

According to the local recruiting officer, a parade will be held in downtown Asheville, and in the afternoon the Reserve armory will be commissioned. A noted Admiral is slated to speak. Open house will be held at the armory on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons, and the public is invited to inspect the building.

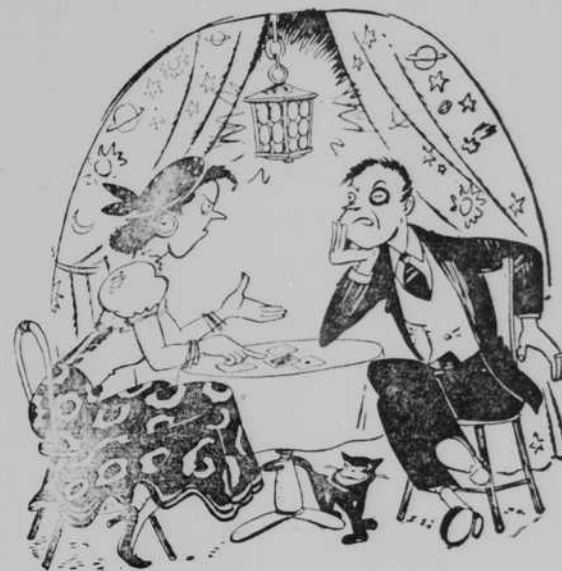

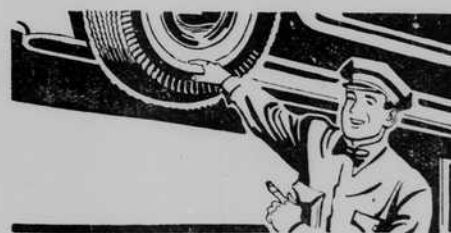

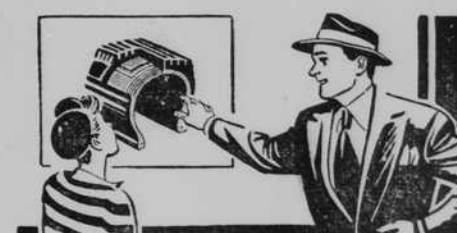
