"Early this fall the outlook was pretty bleak at Brevard College. Then through the courtesy of Mr. Harry H. Straus of the Ecusta Paper Mills, Jack Alexander was "loaned" to Brevard to coach the Tornadoes. Bob Swicegood and Bob Andrews were named assistant coaches and the Tornado became the surprise eleven of the year, gaining momentum as the season progressed.

"As the team gained in experience, Coach Alexander's singlewing offense began to bear fruit with Cliff Riggins, a great halfback, Bam Bam Martin, a high powered fullback, and the brilliant Hersey Hipps, the Tornadoes' 169-pound tailback, paying off in good football. Perhaps the game in which Brevard reached its peak was in its 33-13 triumph over Mars Hill in the last game of the year. The Tornadoes were hard to beat that day.


