The four circles of the Presbyterian church will meet this week, it has been announced.

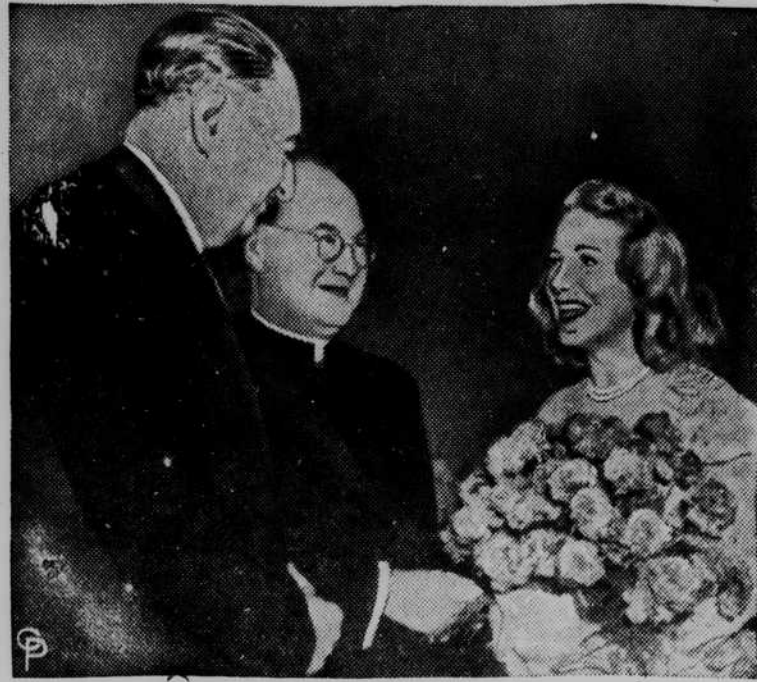
Circle No. 3 will meet Thursday night, December 2, at 8:00 p.m. with Mrs. Eric Neumann.

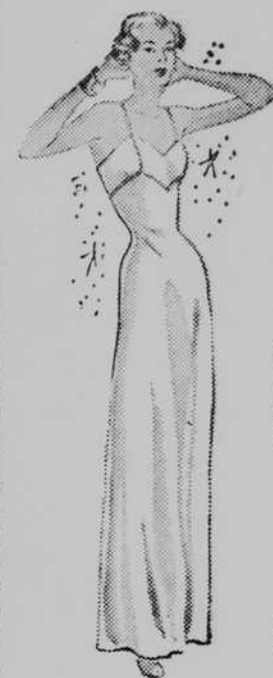
